

EXPLANATION OF TENDER DOCUMENTATION

1	<p>“The tender documentation states that the supplier should include 3 references of significant deliveries in the last 3 years prior to the start of the procurement period.</p> <p>How will this period of 3 years be counted? For example, a supplier has a significant delivery which he uses as a reference which started in January 2017 however this is a 5-year contract which is therefore still active. Is this then ok?”</p> <p>Is it correct that the documents “A46-annex2-contract” and “A46-annex6-handover_report” don’t need to be sent as they are only for the winner?</p>	<p>Explained.</p> <p>The contracting authority requires the supplier to prove that in the last 3 years before the start of the procurement procedure he made at least 3 significant deliveries with a similar subject of performance as the subject of the public contract, ie deliveries of surveillance systems using camera technology with vehicle type recognition, vehicle registration number and state of a registration.</p> <p>It is sufficient for the contracting authority if in the last 3 years the relevant deliveries have been realized, at least in part, in the above-mentioned quality of performance. However, it is not necessary for the contract in question to be delivered completely.</p> <p>It follows from the participant's description that, within the scope of the described delivery, camera technology was already delivered to a certain extent with recognition of the vehicle type, vehicle registration number and state of issue of the registration number. If this assumption is correct, then it is an eligible significant delivery for the purposes of this tender.</p> <p>The mentioned documents (binding draft contract and sample handover protocol) do not have to be sent, but the contracting authority reminds that by submitting a tender the participant agrees with the binding draft contract, while the sample handover protocol is (also) part of the binding draft contract.</p>

In connection with changes in the tender documentation, together with previous ones, and the delayed publication of certain explanations of the tender documentation, the contracting authority extends the deadline for submission of tenders until 25 May 2020 until 12:00 (noon).
